Our Policy and Parent Input

CSE has developed/revised and updated this policy jointly with the LSGT Team, on April 17, 2023, and with parents throughout the year, at PAC meetings, and is distributing by sending home to all the parents of the students, and community, posting on the Website, distributing it at Partnership meetings, Catoosa Kids Day, Catoosa County Collaborative, and it's available in the Family Resource Center. Input is solicited throughout the year at every meeting and on the website. Revision of these documents will be done by the Title I Parent Advisory Council at the end of the school year in order that these documents can be distributed at the beginning of the next school year. One exception is the compact, that is developed at the beginning of the school year. The parent and family engagement policy, grade level specific compacts, and Title I school wide plan are available on CSE website, and in the Family Engagement Resource room, and is distributed at every meeting. It will be our practice to hold an Annual Title I meeting inviting parents and encouraging them to attend. This meeting will be just one of several ways of informing parents of CSE's participation in Title I and explaining Title I, its requirements, and parents' right to know and be involved. Parent & Family Engagement Program and Activities

Meetings for parents will be scheduled at various times in order to allow parents flexibility to fit their schedules. CSE will post minutes of meetings via Remind, School Cast, mailed, sent home with students and post on Website. When needed CSE Title I Funds will be used for transportation, child care for school age students K-5 only, or home visits in order to overcome barriers that might prevent parents from participating in their child's education in this Title I school. We seek to involve parents in an organized, ongoing, timely way in planning, revising, and improving the Title I program. This includes the school's Parent and Family Engagement Policy, and the School Wide Plan being revisited annually. An annual survey will be collected in March and information from these surveys will be used in the revision process. This may be done digitally or virtually.

Cloud Springs Elementary will coordinate and integrate the family engagement programs with the local preschool program and other

federal and state funded preschool programs directly by inviting faculty, staff, and families from those programs to attend meetings focused on family engagement activities. CSE will also coordinate with these programs to ensure that parents are informed about available resources, other programs, and information located in the Resource Center Room 204. This will include working with ESOL students. Transitions to Kindergarten and from 5th grade to 6th grade.

Compacts

Grade level compacts stress the importance of communication between teachers, parents, and students. Parents, students, and teachers sign compacts indicating the role each has in the education process. Typically, parents give input into their role beginning at open house. Teachers are informed about their part in the document and subsequently pen how they will keep parents informed. During the year, compact surveys are shared with the teachers at meetings. Teachers work with students to guide them in writing their promises in achieving their best. Grade-specific compacts are developed, and parents review, adjust and approve them. Official compacts are approved at the fall meeting of the CSE Parent/Family Advisory Council. Compacts are then distributed for signatures and returned by October 31. Compacts should be used at home and at school in parent or student conferences. Compacts include items such as:

What is it?

This plan describes how CSE will provide opportunities to improve parent & family engagement to support student learning. - 1. Reading Goal: Using the 2024 GA Milestones Lexile scores, students in 3rd, 4th, & 5th grade will have a 3% increase in reading levels 2, 3, and 4.
- 2. ELA Goal: Using the 2024 GA Milestones ELA scores, students in 3rd, 4th, & 5th grade will have a 3% increase in ELA levels 2,3, and 4.
- 3. Math Goal: Using the 2024 GA Milestones Math scores, students in 3rd, 4th & 5th grade will have a 3% increase in math levels 2, 3, and 4.
- 4. Science Goal: Using the 2024 GA Milestones scores, students in 3rd, 4th, and 5th grade will have a 3% increase in science levels 2, 3, and 4.

Parents & Families in a timely manner and in language parents and families can understand regarding:
